BE IT RESOLVED, the Board of Directors of Coronado Condominium Owners' Association Inc. has established the following rules and regulations at a regularly scheduled meeting of the Board on November 30, 2009:

Regulations for the Display of the United States Flag and Military Flags Permitted by Law

A Unit Owner may display the United States of America flag and flags that represent the United States Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps, or Coast Guard ("Military Flags") outside their Unit, but only so long as any display conforms to each of the following regulations:

- Flags may only be flown in a respectful manner and during daylight hours.
- Military Flags (as defined above) may only be displayed on Armed Forces Day, Memorial Day, Flag Day, Independence Day, and Veterans Day. Flags representing individual military units, POW flags, or other military flags not listed above may not be displayed under any circumstances.
- Flags must be in good condition and not frayed or excessively faded
- Flags can be no larger than 4.5 feet by 6 feet
- Flag pole can be no larger than 12 feet in length
- Flag pole must be mounted on portable stand and be vertical or in a ground mount to be approved and installed by the Coronado Condominium Owners' Association, Inc. at Unit Owner's expense
- Flag pole must be commercially manufactured pole specifically for the purpose of flying flags
- Flag pole topper, if any, must be either a ball or eagle
- Stand must be placed immediately outside of the entry door but outside of the roofline if the pole is higher than the roofline
- Stand must not be placed on the lawn or in any vegetation
- Nothing may be attached to the building
- No guy wires or other supports may be placed in vegetation or shrub beds
- The displaying Unit Owner is responsible for all damage caused by or resulting from any flag display.
